None of the films manufactured by Sigma Stretch Film undergo animal testing. Some of Sigma's raw material suppliers are required by law to use animals in testing in order to protect public health and the environment; in those cases the suppliers participate in the accreditation process promoted by Association for the Assessment and Accreditation of Laboratory Animal Care (AAALAC) International - a private, non-profit organization that promotes humane animal care and use in science, which is considered the gold standard of laboratory animal care programs.

The **Association for Assessment and Accreditation of Laboratory Animal Care** International, or **AAALAC**, is a private, nonprofit organization that promotes the humane treatment of animals in science through voluntary accreditation and assessment programs. Along with meeting all applicable local and national regulations, AAALAC accredited institutions must also demonstrate that they are achieving the standards outlined in the Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals (National Research Council, 1996).
